Through the **International Studies (IS) Program**, school administration, teachers, students, and parents work collaboratively with foreign ministries of education in Spain, France, Italy, Brazil, and Germany to ensure that the educational requirements and standards of that country are infused and taught in the curriculum. The pedagogy results in the acquisition of a second language.

The **International Baccalaureate (IB) Programme** is a highly coordinated, rigorous course of study linking Humanities, the Sciences, Mathematics, Languages, and Community Service. The curriculum of IB Programmes incorporates standards that assume a high level of aptitude and achievement.

The **Cambridge International Examinations (CIE) Program** is an innovative and accelerated method of academic study offered solely through CIE, part of England's renowned University of Cambridge. It provides an engaging, accelerated, academic experience for motivated learners. Students are challenged to work at the highest level of international standards in Math, Science, English, and Language Arts.

International Education (IE) Programs immerse students in multicultural education with an emphasis on learning a second language. These programs, which are delivered in various, successful, curricular designs, prepare students to live effectively in a fast changing global society and economy.

The **AP | Capstone Program** is designed to complement and enhance the in-depth subject-matter study provided through AP courses. The curriculum leads students to exemplary inquiry, research, collaboration, and communication skills by studying topics of global relevance from an interdisciplinary perspective, making connections between these topics and their AP subjects.

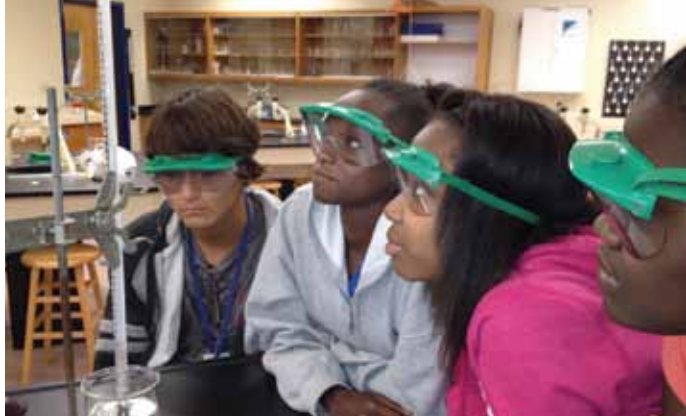

Blended Learning Communities (BLC): Blending Learning Communities (BLC) in all grade 9-12 school sites were developed in an effort for Miami-Dade County Public Schools to meet the new graduation requirement that all students must take an on-line class. All students who entered the 9th grade during the 2011-2012 school year, and every year thereafter, must take an on-line course as part of their graduation requirements. To accomplish these goals, the District has partnered with Florida Virtual School (FLVS) to offer blended learning courses at each school site in the BLC's. ACADEMY SCHOOLS

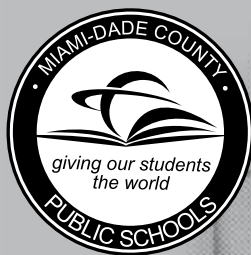
Magnet programs offer unique courses of study focusing on students' special interests, talents, and abilities. Magnet programs are available to students under the following six themes of study:

A LEGACY OF CHOICE

For more than 50 years, Miami-Dade County Public Schools (M-DCPS) has been at the forefront of the choice movement in education, having established Henry S. West Laboratory School in 1954 as an experimental school of choice associated with the School of Education at the University of Miami. This initiative was followed in 1963 by the development and implementation of a dual-language program at Coral Way Elementary School. Magnet programs began in Miami-Dade County Public Schools in 1973 with the opening of a center for the Expressive Arts in the heart of the inner city. Since then, M-DCPS has implemented a broad variety of choice programs including the first corporate-based Satellite Learning Center in 1987; the first controlled open-enrollment schools in 1995; the State's first charter school in 1996; and, most recently, the first District-Managed Charter School in 2011. As of this school year, more than 50% of Pre-K through 12th grade students in M-DCPS have made an active choice in school or program in which they are enrolled.

Choice programs are a sound investment for the future of our students and the business workforce needs of tomorrow. Our entire community benefits from the large array of choice options offered by Miami-Dade County Public Schools. Parents have a clear Choice in Miami-Dade County.

HOW TO APPLY

Magnet applications may be obtained at the school site where the magnet program is located, online at:

or by contacting the School Choice & Parental Options office at: **305-995-1922**.

Magnet applications must be received by the School Choice & Parental Options office by **January 15**. Parents need to inquire at each school to which they are applying as to additional forms, letters, documentation, interviews, and/or auditions that may be required.

TIMELINES:

Applications for Magnet Programs are accepted yearly from October 1 through January 15. Applications received during this period are considered for the following school year. Applications received after this window period are processed only if there are seats available.

ELIGIBILITY:

Application to magnet programs/schools is open to all school-age children who either attend or are eligible to attend a Miami-Dade County Public School.

PROCESS:

Generally, participation in magnet programs is based on the student's interest in one or more of the six themes of study. Parents interested in enrolling their child/children should call the school's magnet lead teacher or magnet secretary to discuss admission requirements and to request an application. Magnet applications may also be obtained from School Choice & Parental

Options from October 1 through January 15 by calling **305-995-1922** or by downloading the application from MIAMI MAGNETS.ORG

Existing M-DCPS parents are encouraged to apply through the Parent Portal.

Schools may have additional requirements as part of the application process; these must be met and delivered to the school(s) prior to the end of the application period. Parents must contact the school directly for entrance requirements and transportation information. Once a completed application is received, eligibility is determined by a variety of factors. When the number of eligible applications exceeds the number of spaces available in a magnet program, a computerized random selection process is used for student selection. Participation in Visual & Performing Arts magnet programs is based on application and audition.

Transportation availability is limited and may not be available to all students. The magnet lead teacher or magnet secretary can assist in determining if a student is eligible for transportation.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Who is Eligible to Attend a Magnet Program? Application to magnet programs is open to all school-age children who either attend or are eligible to attend a Miami-Dade County Public School.

Why Should My Child Attend a Magnet Program? Magnet programs offer an enhanced educational opportunity for students. The six different magnet themes provide a range of choices designed to meet a variety of student interests. The goals of magnet programs are to provide an excellent educational opportunity for students and to facilitate multicultural collaboration and cooperation.

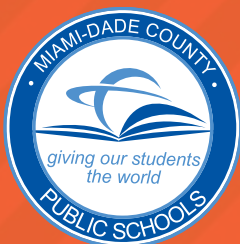
When Do I Apply for Admission to a Magnet Program? Applications for magnet programs are accepted October 1 through January 15 of each school year. Applications received during this period will be considered for the following school year.

How Do I Apply for Admission to a Magnet Program? Parents interested in enrolling their child/children should call the school's magnet lead teacher or magnet secretary to discuss admission requirements and to request an application. We strongly encourage use of the Parent Portal, accessed at www.dadeschools.net, for the application process.

Where Do I Apply for Admission to a Magnet Program? Applications may be obtained at the school where the magnet program is located, online at www.miamimagnets.org, or by contacting the School Choice & Parental Options office at 305-995-1922.

How Are Students Selected for a Magnet Program? When the number of eligible applications exceeds the number of seats available in a school of choice program, a computerized random selection (lottery) process is used for student selection. Eligible students who submit an application by the deadline will qualify for participation in the lottery.

Is Transportation Provided to Magnet Programs? According to School Board guidelines, transportation availability is limited and may not be available to all students. The magnet lead teacher or magnet secretary can assist you in determining if your child/children are eligible for transportation.

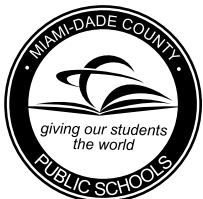
