How does television fit into your young child's overall development? The TV can be a great teaching tool if you connect what your child watches to real life experiences. Let your child know that watching television can be an active experience rather than a passive one.



Ways to Make Your Child An Active Viewer

1. Ask your child questions about what they see and hear on TV.
2. Talk to your child about why they like certain characters.
3. Inspire your child to create images of their own.
4. Engage your child to make connections to the real world based on facts.

Summer Activity: Make a TV Schedule

Help your child make a plan for television viewing. First, decide what shows your child can watch. Then tell your child that together you can make a television schedule. Give him/her paper and markers or crayons. Review the shows he/she can watch. Invite him/her to write down the name of each show and what time it is on. Then hang the schedule up next to the television.
